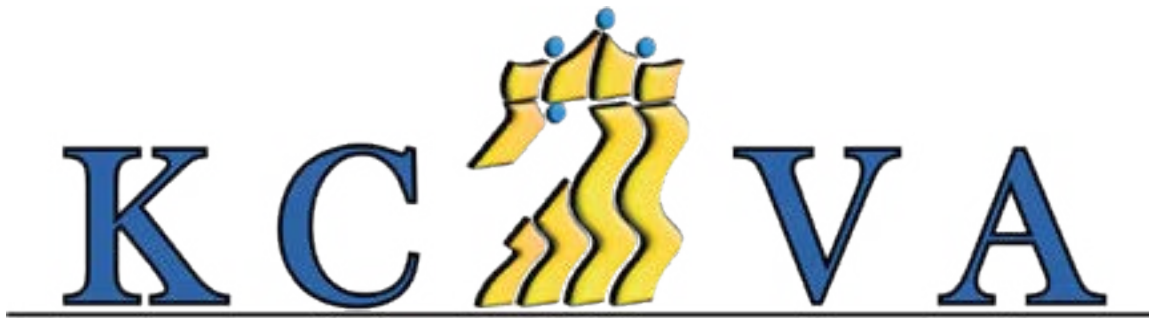

SECURITY

They are scheduled to be on watch on the property **Monday-Friday 4:00 pm until 4:00 am**, a total of 12 hours; and on Weekends we will have security 24 hours a day.

SAFETY:

- Be aware of your surroundings, and be especially careful at ATMs.
- Allow extra time to get to where you are going.
- Lock your doors.

Watch Orders

The Kings Creek Village Association reminds you that when you are going out of town, arrangements should be made to secure your residence. Make sure that the newspaper delivery has been suspended and the postal service will hold your mail (when necessary).

The Kings Creek Village Association can also put a “watch” on your residence. Police officers will be advised that you are away and keep an additional alertness on your property. Watch orders must be requested in writing; we need your name, telephone number in case of emergency, and the day you will be returning.

No Soliciting

Please advise solicitors that they are not permitted to distribute flyers in Kings Creek. Don't open your door to strangers.

Lost and Found

If you **find** something, you can come to the KCVA Management Office (which is on the first floor of the Community Building), and give it to us. Usually we keep the found items at least for one month.

With two playgrounds, kids of all ages can join in on the fun, while mom and dad relax.

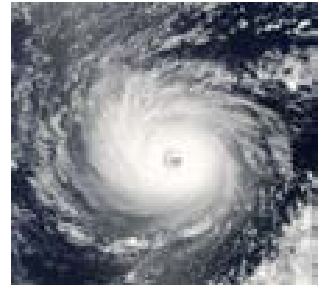

Hurricane Watches and Warnings



- **Tropical Storm Watch**
Tropical storm conditions are possible, usually within 48 hours.
- **Tropical Storm Warnings**
Tropical storm conditions are expected, usually within 36 hours.
- **Hurricane Watch**
Hurricane conditions are possible, usually within 48 hours.
- **Hurricane Warnings**
Hurricane conditions are expected, usually within 36 hours.
- **Tropical Storm**
Sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph
- **Hurricane**
Sustained winds of 74 mph or higher



Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale

- Category 1: 74-95 mph
- Category 2: 96-110 mph
- Category 3: 111-129 mph
- Category 4: 130-156 mph
- Category 5: 157 mph or higher

BEFORE Hurricane Season

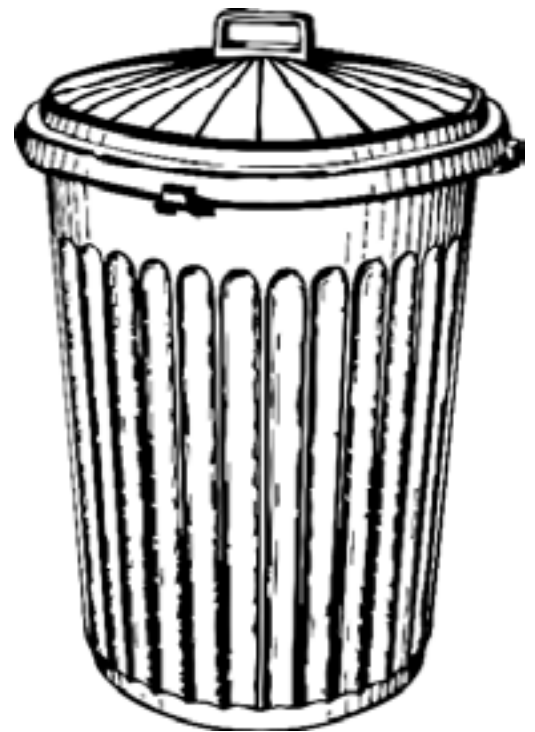
Some preventive maintenance can be done that will go a long way toward protecting property and reducing waste generated during hurricane season if Florida is hit by a storm.

- *Cut back all trees and branches that contact buildings.*
- *Thin out foliage and trees so wind can flow through the branches, decreasing the chances of uprooting during heavy winds.*
- *Place tree trimmings at the curb following the normal rules for yard trash on your scheduled pickup day. (Brush is limited to MAX 4 ft. in length and 4 inches in diameter. Bag up leaves and grass—or leave on lawn for “grass cycling”).*
- *Clear your yard of any items that could become airborne and cause further damage, such as old lumber, lawn furniture, toys, etc. Place them at the curb on your regular “bulky waste” day for pick-up.*

Illegal Dumping

Illegal dumping is a serious crime that can harm our environment and make our neighborhoods look bad. Don't try to confront an illegal dumper. Instead, write down details of the incident if you witness it, such as a description of the vehicle, vehicle markings or a license tag number.

To report an illegal dumping site on public or private property:

- Call 3-1-1
- Residents of Miami-Dade County are able to report neighborhood problems and code violations using 311Direct, a mobile application. 311Direct can be downloaded for free in the iTunes store for Apple users or in the Google Play store for Android users.

If you witness an illegal dumping incident in progress, call 911.

Avoid illegal dumping

Dumping things like tires, debris, old furniture and hazardous materials not only harms the environment and lowers property values, but results in millions of dollars spent on enforcement and cleanup costs.

If Miami-Dade County provides waste service to your residence, consider your options instead of dumping materials illegally:

- Request a Bulky Waste Pickup
- Deliver your items to a Trash & Recycling Center
- Visit a Home Chemical Collection Center

Private contractors can pay a per-ton disposal fee to have materials delivered to Miami-Dade County sites.
